Updates to our Camp KV online registration!

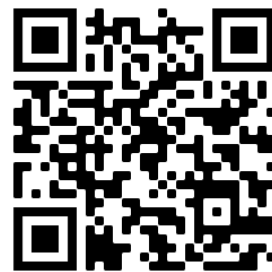

Camp KV is a state licensed day camp located on 70 acres of beautiful, naturally preserved land on Maranacook Lake in Readfield. Our camp begins at 8:00am and ends promptly at 4:00pm.

Camp KV's Counselor In Training (CIT) program gives teens entering grades 9 & 10 an opportunity to build skills that will help them in the classroom the workplace, and beyond.

CIT participants work closely with camp leaders, who serve as instructors and mentors. Participants will spend half their day with a camp unit assisting with activities and learning through first hand experience. The other half the CIT group will be with the Camp Leadership team reflecting, discussing and problem solving the situations they faced during their time with the units.

CIT's walk away with:

- American Red Cross CPR/First Aid

activities

- Outdoorsmanship skills
- Confidence and leadership experience

This four-week program takes place over sessions 4 through 7 only. All CIT participants are required to attend all four sessions.

CAMP INFORMATION

ARRIVAL

Our summer camps offer FREE bus transportation to Camp KV from the Augusta KV YMCA campus.

SIGN IN/SIGN OUT

All campers must be signed in and out daily by a parent/guardian. For your child's safety, photo ID's will be required. For first time pick-ups, please remind other authorized pick-ups that they will need to bring a photo ID with them, as well.

ABSENCES

If your child is not going to attend camp for the day, please report their absence by calling the camp office at 207 685 4644

If your child will be leaving early, please call or notify the camp office in writing of what time and who will be picking up your child.

RAINY DAYS AT CAMP KV

On rainy days, we try to do as much activity outside as possible, which means your campers should come prepared with water-resistant clothing on damp days. On days of heavy rain, we utilize our covered areas and main lodge, where campers engage in indoor activities.

SWIMMING

Campers will have the opportunity to swim at Camp KV. For their safety, all campers will be swim tested on their first day of camp. While swim activities are not required, we strongly encourage all campers to participate.

Lifeguards will be on duty whenever children are in the water.

LUNCH

Lunch

Please pack a healthy lunch along with a few healthy snacks that will last all day, with ice packs.

Be sure to bring a re-fillable water bottle every day and remember to label everything with your child's name.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Kennebec Valley YMCA is proud to offer need-based scholarships for qualifying children to attend camp. Scholarship applications are available at either of our Welcome Centers or online at www.kvymca.org. Scholarships are awarded on a first come, first served basis.



CAMP POLICIES & EXPECTATIONS

DAILY CAMP CHECKLIST

Each camper should bring a backpack with the following items:

- Bathing Suit (must be properly fitting)
- Towel and plastic bag for wet clothes
- Healthy snacks & lunch
- Refillable water bottle
- An extra set of clothes
- Sunscreen! Please make sure campers are wearing sunscreen when they arrive at camp.
- Jacket or sweatshirt for cool weather
- Closed-toe shoes are required. Flip flops can be worn only at the waterfront.

Please label everything!

ITEMS TO LEAVE AT HOME

- Electronic devices
- Cell phones / tablets / computers / cameras
- Toys / trading Cards / sports equipment
- Money / valuable Items
- Weapons of any kind - real or fake

The KV YMCA is not responsible for lost or stolen items

BUS POLICY

Parents must be at pick-ups and drop-offs and are responsible for the supervision of their children before entering the care of the YMCA. Children will not be allowed on the bus without pre-registration and payment completed. If for any reason a camper's transportation has not arrived at the end of the day, parents will be notified for pick-up and may be subject to a late fee.

Campers are expected to follow Camp KV rules while on the bus. Any behavior not in accordance with Camp KV policies will result in parent notification, seat assignment and possible expulsion from the bus program.

BUS SCHEDULES

Busses leave Augusta at 7:40 am

Buses return to Augusta at 4:30 pm

Arrive at 7:20 for the drop off / check in process and plan on being at the Augusta Y at 4:20 for pick up.



CAMPER CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

The staff governs the behavior of each child and attempts to work through conflicts and problems as they occur. A camper who displays negative behavior can affect the rest of the camp's experience. Campers who are disruptive, display inappropriate behavior, or require an undue amount of disciplinary attention will meet with the Camp Director to evaluate their behavior. Parents will be notified of any misconduct or discipline problems. It will be the parent's responsibility to arrange transportation for the child if he/she is being sent home due to disciplinary actions.

If an incident occurs that jeopardizes a camper's safety, the safety of others, or is not in accordance with the mission of the YMCA, camp staff will address and document the issue directly with the child and take the following steps.

- 1. First Violation:** The child may be removed from an activity for the day, such as swimming, free time, etc. Parents may be contacted during the day or at the end of camp depending on the time and severity of the incident.
- 2. Second Violation:** The parent/guardian will receive a phone call and may be asked to pick up their child within the hour. The child may or may not be allowed to attend camp the next day that they are registered for depending on the severity of the incident.
- 3. Third Violation:** Parents may be contacted immediately to pick up their child from camp. The child will be suspended for the day or week that they are registered for depending on the severity of the incident.
- 4. Fourth Violation:** Child may be dismissed from camp for the remainder of the program depending on the severity of the incident.

*Please Note: We reserve the right to, at any time, dismiss your child from the program immediately due to environmental, physical, emotional, or other harm to themselves, other children, and staff. Refunds will not be given for suspension or dismissal.

BULLYING

At Camp KV, bullying is inexcusable, and we have a firm policy against all types of bullying. Each camper is expected to treat all other campers and staff with respect. Our Camp Director addresses all incidents of bullying and trains staff to create a safe and welcoming environment for all.

HEALTHY CAMPERS

If your child contracts anything that may be contagious, please let us know. Your name will be kept confidential but state regulations require us to post any contagious illnesses to all participants.

If your child shows any sign of illness, rash, high temperature (over 100.4), diarrhea, infection, lice, or any contagious diseases, the parent/guardian will be called and expected to pick up the child within one hour.

While camp staff do their best to prevent injuries, sometimes they do happen. Moderate injuries will be communicated to the parent once proper first aid has taken place. If severe injuries need higher medical attention, 911 will be called and parent/guardian will be contacted immediately.

MEDICATION

Medication must be brought in its original container, allowing for proper identification and dosage, as required by state licensing. Please leave all medications with a staff member at drop-off and they will bring it to the Director's Cabin to be locked up. Campers should not have medication in their lunch boxes or backpacks.

Any medications that are to be self-administered (i.e., inhaler) by a camper must be accompanied by a completed Self Administered Medical Form (attached) and returned before their first day of camp.
